



PRA identified in the Giant Schnauzer - can you help our research?

Is your Giant Schnauzer 6 years or over?
The AHT are offering free eye examinations to 20 dogs!*

If your dog has already had a recent eye examination, you can still contribute to the study by submitting a **free DNA sample** to help towards research into a **novel form of progressive retinal atrophy (PRA) we have identified in the Giant Schnauzer.**

PRA is a blinding disease for which there is no treatment, so developing a DNA test would enable breeders and owners to test for this disease and eventually eradicate this disease from the breed.



Recent research into this degenerative eye disease in this breed is progressing well, however to validate our findings and develop a DNA test, we need more DNA samples from Giant Schnauzer's.

Your dog's DNA sample would be beneficial to this research and help to provide a permanent DNA bank to contribute to future research, complementing the Give a Dog a Genome project that the Giant Schnauzer community is a part of: www.aht.org.uk/gdq.
